The Advanced Theological Studies Fellowship Kampen is a month-long research fellowship designed to bring a group of promising international theologians, all of whom are currently engaged in doctoral studies, to the Theologische Universiteit Kampen for a period of extended theological reflection and conversation. Each visiting fellow is given use of the Theologische Universiteit's research facilities in order to prepare a paper which will be presented during one week of seminars. A group of scholars drawn from the TU Kampen and elsewhere will provide responses to these papers. The seminars are open to TU Kampen staff, students and the general public. All seminars will be held in de Senaatskamer of the TU Kampen (Broederweg 15, Kampen).

All seminars and the public lecture are eligible for the **Studium Generale**. One point will be awarded for each event. Reports of the sessions should be handed in at the responding professor of every session.

Dr. George Harinck is Professor of History of Neo-Calvinism at the Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam and Professor of History of Protestantism at the Theological University in Kampen. He also serves as Director of the Archives and Documentation Center at Kampen Theological University. Harinck leads the recently founded Neo-Calvinism Research Institute at TU Kampen.
