## About us

The Theological University in Kampen was established in 1854 as the academic institution of the Reformed Churches in the Netherlands. To us, doing theology means:

- being faithful to the Scriptures;
- working from a Reformed confessional perspective;
- serving churches in the Netherlands and abroad;
- equipping theology teachers and Christian leaders from around the world.

In short, we strive to connect Bible and life.

Our university has about 150 students and offers state accredited Bachelor's, Master's and Doctoral programmes. Our community fosters an open attitude to Christians from around the world and we host a growing number of international students. Our theological library is up-to-date and well equipped, which makes the university attractive to national and international theologians and researchers. All this ensures that an Erasmus exchange programme in Kampen is interesting and enriching!

# About the City of Kampen

Kampen is a compact city with a beautiful historical city centre, which shows the rich past of the town, going back as far as the Middle Ages! Larger cities, such as Zwolle and Amsterdam, are within easy reach by means of public transportation. Next to your studies, there are ample possibilities for enjoying

social life, culture and nature in and around Kampen. There are many recreational and cultural facilities (shops, restaurants, theatre, cinema, swimming pool, museums, concerts, fitness centres), as well as possibilities for walking and cycling in the neighbourhood. Feel welcome to Kampen!





## Erasmus programme

The TU Kampen offers Erasmus+ students opportunity to study in Kampen for a period of three to twelve months. Tuition fees are not required by the Theological University. Your home institution will give you full academic recognition for the awarded credits at the Theological University. Therefore, a Learning Agreement between your home institution and the Theological University Kampen should be prepared, stipulating the programme to be followed. Please contact the Erasmus coordinator at your home institution for guidance!





## Study programmes

There is quite a variety of subjects you can study as an exchange student, both in our Bachelor's and Master's programme.

For Bachelor students we maintain a flexible system: many modules can be taught either in Dutch or English, depending on the students in the class. The main idea of the exchange in the Bachelor's programme is to obtain international experience and to become immersed in a different culture and institution. The programme will be discussed on a personal level.

For the Master's programme, international students typically choose a specialization in a specific subject or topic. In this brochure you will find a list of available modules in the Master's programme. Combinations of modules from different disciplines are possible. Don't hesitate to contact us for more information and possible study tracks!

## Personal approach

We cherish our high standards of academic education, which include personal interaction with our teachers, good library facilities, and personal support by our International Office. We also have a 'buddy system' in place, which means that one of our Dutch students will act as a 'buddy' for you personally. There are also many opportunities for fellowship with other international and Dutch students. We will do our best to make you feel at home!



## Worship

We worship together at our weekly Chapel and share our needs in the English prayer group. The Eudokia Reformed church provides English translation during the morning services and our student pastor is available for personal conversations.





## Cost of living

Our university does not have a student campus, but we will help you to arrange suitable accommodation in Kampen. Costs will be about € 400.- a month. Remaining costs of living for a student are approximately € 300.- per month (meals, transportation and various activities).

## Insurances

Please check at your insurance company which costs are covered in the Netherlands. If necessary, you should take out additional insurances. Your insurance company can provide you with a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC). Besides your health insurance, you will probably need a separate liability insurance as this is not always covered by your national health insurance! We can help you to arrange this.

# Start your application

## Academic year

The academic year consists of four study periods:

- A.** September – October
- B.** November – January
- C.** February – 1<sup>st</sup> half of April
- D.** 2<sup>nd</sup> half of April – June.

In each period there are six weeks of lectures followed by a period to prepare for exams and write papers. For exact information about dates and study periods please visit our website.

## Master Programme

All Master's modules are 6 ECTS credits, unless otherwise indicated. 1 ECTS credit amounts to 28 hours of study. The letters before each module mentioned below, refer to the four study periods in which the module is offered (A-D, see *Academic year*). The letter F ('flexible') means, that the modules can be offered in different periods. As a rule, these 'flexible' modules are individually guided reading tracks, not lectures.
